eForesee is a two-year EU-funded FP5 project which addresses challenges faced by policy makers implementing foresight activities for smaller economies and regions. In particular it examines the potential role of foresight in dealing with the structural changes to the economy that accompany the Accession process, as well as the integration of accession states into a European Research Area. It explores the decision-making processes involved in setting up foresight activities, as well as the challenge of managing and implementing specific foresight actions and creating a community of foresight practice. Partners in Cyprus, Estonia and Malta are carrying out a series of Pilot projects focused on themes of current interest in their regions. The first theme of the Malta foresight Pilot is Exploring Knowledge Futures in ICT and Education in 2020.

The aim of this half-day consultation is to present and discuss the Vision Document produced at the end of the first phase of the foresight activity to the key stakeholders and policymakers, in order to confirm the robustness of the vision, to ensure dissemination and awareness of the activity and the results and to kick-start its implementation.
